We in the past held four meetings for the International Conference of Health Behavioral Science. The 1st conference, back in August 1988 in Hawaii, USA was under the main theme of “Traditional & Modernity in Health Care”. The 2nd conference, in September 1991 in Tokyo, Japan received around the main theme of “Health Care Systems How Should It Be in 21st Century”. The 3rd conference, also in Tokyo, in September 1996 was under the main theme of “Crisis Behavior toward Growth & Solidarity”. The 4th conference, in April, 2001 in Kobe, Japan was under the main theme of “Integrated Approaches to Health”. Now, the 5th International Conference of Health Behavioral Science is to be held in August 2006 in Bangkok, Thailand under the main theme of “Education on Health and Environment Integrated

Medicine and Environmental Education.” The external environmental problems relating to life and health have caused a serious situation, which in turn causes a further serious future situation. The environmental problems of the past directly contributed to our current internal environmental problems via our genes and memories, and they make it pretty difficult for us to surmount the current external environmental problems.

Behavioral science aims to get a hold of the mutual functions between life and environment at various levels from molecules, cells, and tissues to individual people, groups of people, society, the earth and the universe, to explicate them systematically as well as empirically, and thus to contribute to the solution of our problems.

At the forthcoming 5th conference we plan to study by way of behavioral sciences how to solve health problems as the mutual functions between life and environment from the view point of education.

I hope for the enrichment of the conference through lively and international discussions among the participants from various countries and specializations, and for the pursuit of effectual methods for an educational solution.

The 5th International Conference of Health Behavioral Science

BACKGROUND



The Japan Academy for Health Behavioral Science will host the 5th International Conference of Health Behavioral Science, *Integration of Health & Environmental Education: Integrative Medicine and Environmental Education*, which will be held August 16th-21st, 2006, in Bangkok, Thailand. The Conference will include a special and a keynote speech, a local excursion to an integrative health care facility, oral presentations, poster presentations, a symposium, satellite symposiums, workshops, and an optional sightseeing tour.

Since 1986, when the Academy was established, the Academy has hosted four different international conferences. A quick review of the themes of past conferences shows an interesting trend. The 1st International Conference, *A Transcultural Discussion*, was held in August of 1988 at the Pacific Beach Hotel in Honolulu, Hawaii. The 2nd International Conference, *The Health Care Systems, How Should It Be in the 21st Century?*, was held in September of 1991 at Sophia University in Tokyo. The 3rd International Conference, *Crisis Behavior toward Growth and Solidarity*, was held in September of 1996, also at the Sophia University in Tokyo, and the 4th International Conference, *Integrated Approaches to Health*, was held in August in Kobe, Japan at Konan University. The Academy has recently been discussing the following themes: health promotion, QOL (quality of life), biomedical ethics, care of the terminally ill, counseling, holistic medicine and narrative approaches.

In order to fully examine each of these themes, we will take an interdisciplinary approach drawing on each of the different sciences to enable the most thorough discussion of health behavioral science. Currently, we are faced with various problems regarding life and bioethics due to the development of such life science technology as cloning techniques, abortion, sterilization, artificial contraception, chemotherapy, surrogate pregnancy, gene therapy, organ transplants and regenerative medicine. Issues such as the rights of brain-dead patients and related concerns dealing with informed consent are also at the center of contemporary bioethics. All of these issues demand a deep understanding of the roles various kinds of environments play in human life.

In regards to global environmental problems, there is the destruction of the natural environment such as global warming, acid rain, desertification, deforestation, and a decrease in biodiversity. Problems in the social environment • include the North-South problem, the widening gap between the levels of social and economic systems in the world, and the concept of sustainability and development. Another consideration is the mind environment which relies on input from both the natural and the social environment. Disturbances in those environments can negatively affect the environment of the mind, a problem which is becoming increasingly noticeable in many important social facets of life such as communication. This imbalance in the mind environment demands an overhaul both of lifestyle choices and environmental ethics. Accordingly, we need to make efforts towards solving the problems surrounding bioethics and the environment. Therefore, we will discuss the goal of a healthy life through a sound environment from the holistic and integrative perspective.

In order to restore and promote a healthy life in the 21st century, our goals are to promote the study and the discussion of Integrative Medicine and Education from a global perspective and to encourage a deeper level of international exchange among countries. Throughout the Symposium, in addition to the topics mentioned above we will also discuss the latest developments in the fields of health and the environment. We will also promote health behavioral science and environmental education studies for the goal of a sustainable future

We welcome all participants to the International Conference.

Forum A-1 Practical Study on Behavioral Modification

No one plans on becoming sick and being forced to view life from a patient's standpoint. But it happens every

day to seemingly normal people when suddenly their bodies betray them. Such rapid onset results in many patients having a lot of difficulty fully comprehending their situation. This can potentially put them at odds with medical staff whose objective treatment goals may be out of the range of understanding for many patients. This creates the main gap between the patient's perspective and the staff's intentions. In reality, chronic illness patients (particularly the elderly) need to aggressively tackle the problems surrounding their quality of life and take a pro-active approach to diet and exercise. In this symposium, we will report on practical cases of behavioral modification using lifestyle changes which elderly and chronic illness patients used to make the effort of re-claiming their health. **Keywords:** Behavioral Modification/Medical Behavior of Health/Health Promotion/Elderly Persons/Chronic Illness Patients

Forum A-2 Health Promotion and Developing Participation of the General Public

Those who are interested in making a presentation are requested to prepare a printed abstract on the enclosed Abstract Form (Refer to Form A-3) with the completed Application Form (Form A) and forward them via Airmail to the Registration Secretariat or send the materials through the website. Facsimiled submissions will not be accepted.

Rules on Authorship

1. Abstract Submissions are limited to the Conference Homepage or Airmail.
2. Registrations (including payment of registration fees) must be completed by Wednesday, 31 May, 2006.
3. Abstracts are limited to material not presented/published at a past domestic or international conference.
4. Facsimiled and onsite submission of abstracts is not allowed.

Instructions for Authors

Application Form (Form A-1)

1. Provide all the required information and select your preferred presentation theme from those listed on page 8.

2. Write down 5 keywords.
3. Select your preferred method of presentation, either oral poster, or no preference.

Abstract Form (Refer to Form A-3)

1. The abstract, including title, author(s), affiliation(s) and text must fit within the box.
2. The abstract title should be printed in CAPITAL LETTERS to the right of the box for program numbers. Author(s) name(s) should be listed directly below the program number box, starting on the left side of the page. Family Name, First Name/Middle Initial, in that order. The presenting author's name should be underlined.
3. Affiliation(s) should be listed on the next line. It is not necessary to leave a space. For the **presenter only**: include **city and country names** as well. In the event of multiple affiliations, separate each one by a number. Leave **one line space** between affiliations and the main body of the text.
4. The body of the abstract must be within 450 words, must be in 11 or 12 point Times (or similar) font, and must have no paragraph breaks. Do not print text outside the margin lines. If you are unable to directly print onto the form provided, print onto A4 (29.7 cm x 21.0 cm), white paper, with a minimum 2.5 cm margin around the edge of the paper.
5. Upper-left highlighted box is for internal use only. (do not write anything in this space)
6. Abstracts will be photo-printed exactly as received. Any smudges, errors or misspellings in the original abstract will also show in the final published version.
7. One original, three copies of the original, the floppy disk containing the data of the original and Application Form (Form A-1) must be submitted to the Registration Secretariat with a piece of cardboard to protect the original. Do not fold or bend the original Abstract Form as any creases will also appear in the final printed version.
8. The submitted abstracts will appear in the Book of Abstracts to be distributed to participants during the conference. Changes to the content or alteration of letters will not be possible after the abstract has been submitted. Also, keep in mind that some abstracts may be posted on-line as received.

Confirmation of Receipt

A Confirmation of Receipt will be sent to you by Facsimile or E-mail after your abstract has been received.

Notice of Screening Results

Abstracts will be formally be reviewed by the 5th International Conference of Health Behavioral Science Executive Committee, which reserves the right to make the final decision on all abstracts. All persons who have submitted an abstract will be informed of whether or not it has been accepted by E-mail, or for those who do not have an E-mail address, facsimile (or Airmail), in late June. Together with this notice, selected applicants will receive information on their method of presentation and instructions on how to submit the full text of the paper. Abstracts that have been submitted will not be returned, regardless of the outcome of the executive committee screening.

Publication of Conference

Conference Proceedings for the 5th International Conference of Health Behavioral Science will be published after the conference is over. You will complete an article, and will submit the paper during the conference to the Registration. Further details will be made available to presenters.
